The course presents grammar categories of adjectives and adjectival pronouns, degrees of adjectives, cases of personal pronouns, reflexive verbs, and grammatical categories of quantitative and multiplicative numerals, prefix and suffix formation, subjunctive and imperative mood, neuter gender and adverbs.
